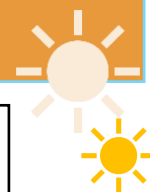

One of the areas we have been looking at during our visits is the behaviour. It was great to see how attentive the children were during their lessons and the staff managed them confidently. During a visit where health and safety was a focus, it was noted that though the original school building needs decorating, this would be an ongoing project to take place over the next few years in order to manage finances so that the children's learning is not impacted. School finances are monitored regularly to ensure the money is spent appropriately and we are more than happy that the school has done this despite ever reducing budgets.

We were lucky enough to spend a whole day in school visiting classrooms to see a variety of lessons as well as speaking to the staff and children. It was a really great day and we were so proud of the children. As children tend to be, they were typically honest about their feelings about the school but these were very positive. The curriculum leaders we spoke with presented their plans for the curriculum and it was obvious that they have amazing ideas to further develop what the children are learning to make the progress even better. We had chance to be in the playground and the hall during lunch time and were impressed with how well the children behaved and interacted with us all.
